General Superintendents' Growth Award

"I planted ...God made it grow" (1 Cor. 3.6)

The purpose of the General Superintendents' Growth Award (GSGA) is to give prominence to those practices that are central to the local and worldwide advancement of the church; specifically, new Nazarenes, significant involvement in sponsoring a new church, and 100% participation in fund allocations.

Scott Stearman was specially commissioned to sculpture "The Sower." This symbol was chosen because it represents the prerequisites of harvesting. It recalls the words of the Psalmist, "He who goes out weeping, carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, carrying sheaves with him." (Psalm 126:6) It draws directly from Paul's analogy, in 1 Corinthians 3:6, "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow."

- Churches that win people to Christ are healthy.
- Starting new churches is the most effective means of evangelism known to the church.
- Fund allocations are essential to the cooperative ministries of the Church of the Nazarene.

New Nazarenes requirements are based on 10% of attendance for the current year. The meaning of "**significant involvement in sponsoring a new church**" is very specific and is spelled out in the Sponsorship Criteria Worksheet. This worksheet is available online with the Local Forms packet. **Full participation in fund allocations** includes district assignment, educational support, pensions (applicable to US only), and World Evangelism Fund.

- The requirements for receiving this award are intentionally high—it is a special recognition by the Board of General Superintendents.
- It is not based on attendance or membership.
- This award is not intended to replace all awards. Other Global Ministry Center entities will continue to offer their respective awards. Districts will continue to offer their awards.

This award is given in recognition of outstanding accomplishment in essential practices of the expansion of the kingdom of God through the Church of the Nazarene. The presentation of this unique and beautiful sculpture is intended to say "Thank You" to the receiving pastor and church, and to elevate in the consciousness of our people the compelling importance of winning people to Christ, starting new churches, and supporting the organizational structures that make possible evangelism around the world.

Report of the District Superintendent Virginia District Church of the Nazarene J. Phillip Fuller, D. Min. June 1, 2020

I Don't Want to Go Back

"I don't want to go back to Church." I never thought I would say such a thing, but I am serious. I do not want to go back if going back means *status quo*. An every-hundred-year pandemic overwhelmed our minds, our hearts and our sanctuaries. We've learned new things, such as coronavirus, flattening the curve, and social distancing. We've learned about facemasks and 20-second handwashing. We've experienced death and sadness. We seem certain to experience an economic recession and possibly a depression. Worst of all we're experiencing the loss of hope. Gatherings of more than 10 people were banned in an effort to reduce the spread of the virus. We were left asking, "What happens to the church? How can we be the church if we cannot gather in the way we've done for centuries?" And yet, look at the church now: Fully engaged in mission, dispensing hope, alive and well living into a season of enlarged territory, responsibility and challenge. By some measures the church is growing faster than ever.¹

A high school friend of mine, a well-established, mid-west attorney regularly posts, "That's it! Game over!" He is convinced that life, as he knew, loved and enjoyed it, is over. He may be right. Nevertheless, as I said to him in a recent post around Easter, "No matter what happens, *hope* is not cancelled!"

I believe this time is one of the church's finest hours! Despite unprecedented changes the church pressed into mission, making Christlike disciples in Virginia and beyond. Leaders stepped forward with creativity, technologies were readily embraced, with hope through the person of Jesus Christ, the Son of the living God revealed to us by His Spirit.

Hope and Action Lead the Way

The message of hope is always relevant in times of turmoil, confusion and in the loss of trusted and reliable methods. In such circumstances a compass pointing to true north is a much more valuable tool that an outdated road map. Gratefully our mission (more than our methods) keeps us focused and on target. Christ, the true north star, guides our steps. He came to "seek and to save that which was lost." Luke 19:10. We are not hindered by the storm, because we are guided by our mission. Frankly, storms clarify the mission more quickly than most any other thing. Churches are making quicker decisions. Decision structures are less cumbersome.

God is actively using our churches. Many churches host Celebrate Recovery gatherings, thousands of homes have been blessed with food from our pantries, clothed from our closets, and blessed by our generosity. The Church not only speaks hope but acts with hope giving clarity. Churches care for the sick and the families of the dying, offering words of comfort to the hurting. Examples of Good Samaritans are not the exception but the rule. And Pastors

the West, the statistic would have been that between 8-15% of all churches were growing. So literally in 30 days, we've moved from a tiny percentage of churches growing to virtually half of all church growing. What's even more surprising is that the growth trends hold up in ever church size category."

creatively know that touching lives can even mean something as simple as pulling up to a person's home, in order to wave and pray from the socially distant driver's seat, or creating a 90-second encouragement video 50 days in a row, or planning an evening prayer gathering where hundreds gather.

Local Churches have been innovative, creative, and report these highlights:

- 1517 conversions to the Christian faith. 87 of our 99 reporting congregations had at least one person they recognize in this journey to faith.
- 449 persons were baptized this year. During prior fiscal year, which lasted only 11 month we celebrated 100 more baptisms. Sadly 38 (40%) of our churches did not experience even one baptism. Reminds me that for many churches the best solution to many of their problems would include 3-5 baptisms in a year's time.
- 507 New members of the Church of the Nazarene which represents 3.5% growth of our overall membership number. Forty percent of our churches did not receive one new member. Imagine with me what could have been. Praise God that adding total gains, transfers and loses, we report a 1% growth in overall membership.
- Five New Ministries:
 - Although we officially closed one ministry (Dulles Family Life) we are glad to recognize that God is doing new things (We thank Gary O'Shell).
 - Southside Amelia Campus Church A ministry partnership between Southside and the District (We welcome Wayne and Carol Lynch to the pastoral leadership role)
 - Living Well @ Riverdale Our Grandview Heights ministry closed, holding its last service on Easter 2020. A new ministry is being birthed in the facilities in partnership with our Living Well Church in Salem.
 - Chesapeake Iglesia is a dream in the heart of Renacer con Cristo and has already held Bible studies and trusting God for the future.
 - Norfolk Calvary re-start in a partnership with Virginia Beach First.
 - Smithfield Re-start where we own a building but do not have an effective present ministry there now. Praying to establish ministry there soon.
- Several of our Churches have walked through significant transitions this year, including Salem Fields Community Church, Tidewater Central, Norfolk Calvary, Portsmouth, Leesburg, Richmond Connecting Pointe, Virginia Beach El Shaddai, Richmond Hope Community, Dinwiddie, Richmond El Remanente. Hampton sold its facilities to Puerta de Salvación closing at the beginning of the pandemic allowing Hampton Church to continue as a house church model, and freeing Puerta de Salvación to enlarge its ministry in Hampton.
- Our years of Church planting produced the fruit of four new fully organized churches in Williamsburg, Lorton, Salem and Woodstock.

Studies and Credentialing

Brad Billet, Steve Guizar and Rigoberto Acosta and their respective teams deserve tremendous praise for the way they shepherd our ministerial students. This year we mentored 85 or more persons through the process of ministerial credentials. At least 22 persons started into the ministerial course of study by registering with the Studies Board this year, and we are refining and improving our relationship with Nazarene Bible College, our District Training Center and our Istituto Teologico Nazareno for the absolutely best possible service to the church and to our students in ministerial preparation. We celebrate all those who have reached a recommendation for ordination, the renewal of their district license and those who will for the first time receive their district license this year.

Encouragement

We (Rigoberto Acosta, George Stevenson and I) have visited nearly all of our churches in some form or fashion this year. We preached. We encouraged. We conducted 16 church/pastoral review. We met with church boards and shared many prayers with pastoral leaders across this great district. Ministry in local churches is difficult. When pastors feel as if they are all alone the work becomes doubly difficult. We do our best to offer a presence that helps pastors from feeling that they are alone in this work. Thank God we are in this together. As a district family we asked churches to report conversions and baptisms each month. We prayed asking God to show us where to launch new ministries. We promoted ministries for children and youth, such as quizzing, camps and retreats. This year's Teen Winter Retreat was a highlight of a spiritually focused weekend with tremendous kudos to the NYI Leadership for pulling off such a major event with such spiritual poise. We encouraged peer-to-peer learning in our Teaching Church gatherings (thank you Adrian Mills and Camelot Shuff). Our Zone Pastor's Huddles offered resources, training and connections. Our Ministry Team Retreat had the largest attendance in 17 years with special thanks to Dr. Ron Blake and Brian Arner guests at our retreat. We established three important new developments once the pandemic hit us: (1) Touching Every Pastor's Home with the help of five retired pastoral couples: Mike & Sue Brown, Gary & Susan Smith, Rigoberto & Martha Acosta, George & Glorice Stevenson, Bill & Jean Dillon so that every pastor would receive a personal, supportive and prayerful phone call every week. (2) We started the <u>COVID HOPE FUND</u> seeded initially with \$25,000 to provide for our pastors if and when financial hardships ensued; and (3) nearly every Thursday HOPE HAPPENS Zoom meetings with guests from near and far who shared with us about the ways the church sharing hope, experiencing hope and acting with hope in our hearts.

With the help of God, I have attempted my very best to "build morale, provide motivation, supply management and method assistance, and to organize and encourage the organization of new churches and missions everywhere."² I recognize that I cannot do this work alone.

His decision to invest in the construction of the church over Oliver Cromwell's forceful desire for him to finance the war effort eventually cost Shirley his life at age 27 while incarcerated in London Tower Were it not for an inscription over the door of the main entrance to Staunton Harold Church, Shirley would be a forgotten character in history. The inscription read,"³

In the years 1653 when all things sacred were throughout ye Nation either demolished or profaned, Sir Robert Shirley Baronet, founded this church, whose singular praise it is <u>to</u> have done the best things in ye worst times and hoped them in the most calamitous.⁴

The history of Sir Robert Shirley forever says of him that he hoped for the best things "in the most calamitous" of times, and he, did "the best of things in the worst of times." Hope? Yes! And action, too!

I don't want to go back to Church if going back means a return to *status quo*. Once you learn to be the best of things in the worst of times you want to be the best of things at all times. Pastors, lay leaders, members, and friends, I'm grateful for you, and that with God's help, pandemic or not, we are living in one of the church's finest hours.

2019-2020 Nazarene Missions International (NMI) District President's Report

Dr. Fuller, and members of our unified gathering I bring you my fifth report as District NMI President of the great Virginia District Church of the Nazarene.

What is perfect vision? 20/20 is good vision. It's a standardized measurement of how you compare to the average visual acuity. What 20/20 means is that you can clearly see, on a distance of 20 feet, what the "average" person sees at 20 feet. An ophthalmologist who prescribes tools for helping people *see* and getting their vision close to 20/20 put it this way. "Nothing is more rewarding than seeing the look on the face of a patient as they realize how much better the world appears with clarity."

Here we are in 2020! What kind of vision do you have? Do you have clarity for the future? I'm certain that most did not have a vision of seeing the pandemic we are currently experiencing, and now that it is here, how are you viewing it?

Philippians 4:8 says "Position ourselves to see. Stop looking at the wrong things and start looking at the right things. Resist the distractions." Don't let COVID-19 distract you from the many ways to stay connected spiritually, and remember that NMI and the global church is still at God's business. Lola Brickey, Global NMI Director, said "We are one body working together to make Christlike disciples in the nations." We still are. Virginia District NMI is also about God's business.

Some outstanding highlights of this year include:

- 5.55% (\$876,324) was given toward World Evangelism Fund (WEF). Praise be to God! The work of NMI continues!
- \$28,145.25 was given towards Nazarene Compassion Ministries Child Sponsorship by Virginia churches.
- \$10,090.78 provided support for World Mission Broadcast.
- Alabaster offerings amounted to \$36,715.85.
- Two scholarships were awarded to our youth to go on a Work and Witness project.
- Many churches participated in Faith Promise giving and reported 'above and beyond' results.
- Two Children's Missions *Jamborees* were planned with our Links missionaries telling their story of serving on the Mission field. This is becoming an annual event that gives our children opportunities to hear and learn from *live* missionaries on the field.
- A total of \$36,747.36 was given towards Nazarene Compassionate Ministries projects.
- \$11,630 was collected for the Jesus Film Project.
- A district Work and Witness trip to Africa Nazarene University was planned for July but is now scheduled for June, 2021.

Virginia District Nazarene Missions International has always risen to the universal challenge of reaching the world for Christ by their giving. You are generous and open-hearted! Thank you!

Those who serve with me on the Virginia District NMI Council are exceptional! It is your behind-the-scenes work for which I am thankful, especially in all you do to help me advocate for our mission purpose.

To say that there are challenges ahead is an understatement. The practices that this pandemic cannot touch are *praying* for our lost world, *giving* to WEF and Alabaster, *communicating, conversing with, and caring* for our Links missionaries, and *telling* our youth and children about the mission of the church. We STILL need to be the church. A. W. Tozer said, "*What we need very badly these days is a company of Christians who are prepared to trust God as completely now as they know they must do at the last day. For each of us the time is coming when we shall have nothing but God. Health and wealth and friends and hiding places will be swept away, and we shall have only God. To the man of pseudo faith that is a terrifying thought, but to real faith it is one of the most comforting thoughts the heart can entertain."*

That is a promise! We have God as our assurance. If he promises this, and he does, we can press on and be the church to a world that needs Him more than ever. I encourage you to continue to keep doing the phenomenal mission work you do. Find creative ways to share LINKS with your church. Take advantage of our virtual training sessions we will offer throughout the year. Encourage and take advantage of opportunities to show our youth and children what missions is all about. Get involved in Nazarene Compassionate Ministries projects. Throughout this year we are encouraging Child Sponsorship on the Virginia District.

During the Great Depression, General Superintendent J. G. Morrison kept Nazarene Missions alive with his plea to Nazarenes, "Can't you do just a little bit more?" The church responded with overwhelming results. The question has never been more relevant than what we are facing today. Can't we do just a little bit more as we work to connect local churches and Nazarene missionaries?

2019-2020 Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) District President's Report

Dr. Sunberg, Dr. Fuller, Pastors, leaders and members of the VA Churches of the Nazarene:

Your VA District SDMI has been hard at work this year. Our goal at the onset of the year was put action to the direction where God has been leading us as we have had a few years of asking some pretty pointed questions. I personally was asking the Lord, if someone walked into my local church and wanted to meet Jesus and be discipled, would I trust that the community, programs, etc. that were in place lead this on this journey well? Then from a district level, does the VA District SDMI significantly impact in efficient and effective ways the discipleship efforts of the local church? If our answer was no, then what gaps can we seek to bridge for the local church to help shore up the path of discipleship in their context.

Scott Rainey, the new SDMI Global Ministry Director, articulated this journey of grace which is the framework of discipleship for the Church of the Nazarene. We understand that as God leads us on our journey to Himself, He does so through Prevenient Grace, Saving Grace, and Sanctifying Grace. This journey that each person is on is joined by others, by the local church, by the VA District SDMI with intentional action that enables and encourages their drawing closer to Jesus.

With this framework in mind, your VA District SDMI Council invited Dianne Tolliver to help guide us through the plethora of ideas and narrow some action steps so that we can work on "Bridges" to and for the local churches. These bridges will enable churches who may have gaps to bridge the gap with resources, leadership training, and events. For instance, with regard to saving grace, we already provide camps whose sole purpose is to give opportunity for souls to come to Jesus with deeper commitment and increased surrender. Below is a score card for the next three years that will serve as an example of some of the things that we hope to continue and initiate in order for the Journey of Grace in our local churches to be a well-lit, oft traveled path to Jesus with bridges, that undergird their efforts, and synergy to strengthen their steps.

2019-2020 Black Ministries District Coordinator's Report

Dr. Carla Sunberg, Dr. J. Phillip Fuller, and the Virginia District Church Family:

It is a joy to serve in the capacity of Black Ministries Coordinator for the VA District. We have a strong team of great leaders, of which, I am proud to be associated.

NBNC - I've devoted the Lion's share of my time working at the national level, in hopes that my work would have an impact here in Virginia. Our Black Strategic Readiness Team (BSRT) worked long and hard to plan our 2020 National Black Nazarene Conference. This event was to be held at the Atlanta Evergreen Marriot in Stone Mountain, GA. However, due to the national pandemic, we decided to cancel our conference.

NTS Roundtable - On August 1-3, 2019 we hosted a Young Black Leaders Roundtable Event at NTS. Approximately twenty promising young leaders from across the US attended, including two from Richmond Woodville. Our goal is to help develop these young people for leadership in the Church of the Nazarene. These young people were able to sit in interactive sessions with some of our most respected denominational leaders. Our BSRT is planning a 2021 Young Black Leaders Conference to continue our efforts to develop these young Black leaders for service.

CPE - In cooperation with Rev. Mark Bane, Director of USA/Canada Evangelism & New Church Development, we sponsored a Fall 2019 Church Planting Essentials class in Atlanta, GA for 20 Black Ministers. Thanks to resources provided by VA District and Rev Bane's office, I was able to take 3 local ministers from Richmond Woodville to this key training event.

Black Ministries - Consultation - In cooperation with Dr. Sunberg and Dr. Busic, we participated in a national Black Ministries Consultation discussion. About twenty persons participated in these meetings, including Dr. Fuller and 4 DS's, the BSRT, Dr. Chambo, Dr. Broadbooks and Dr. Hodgson from the Office of Mission Strategy. These meetings resulted in a renewed emphasis to recruit and train Black leaders. Our BSRT held a Sept. 2019 follow-up meeting in Atlanta, whereby goals and strategies were put in place to achieve this objective. The aforementioned Young Black Leaders Conference is a result of those strategy sessions.

Leadership Development Gift - Our National Black Ministries Office recently received a substantial gift of 100k to assist in recruiting and training Black leaders. This resulted from conversations I held with one of our denominational leaders at the 2019 Compassionate Ministries Conference at Indianapolis Shepherd Community COTN. In this conversation I conveyed my concern over the lack of resources, time and effort being devoted to the development of Black leaders in the Church at large. This leader was key in acquiring this gift for Black Leadership development. Additionally, the BSRT has planned activities to strengthen and encourage our current group of Black pastors.

Urban Camp - The Urban Camp was phased out as a separate camp and merged with our VA district camp. Scholarships will be offered to Urban youth and a special effort will be made to get them to attend our Virginia District Camp. Feel free to direct any needy minority youth to me if they need assistance to attend.

MLK Celebration - The plans for a districtwide Martin Luther King Jr. celebration in 2020 were derailed. We have moved this event to 2021. I encourage as many as possible to mark your calendars and plan to attend. We anticipate holding this service in Charlottesville. This event is a celebration of the rich diversity we enjoy in Virginia and the "Dream" that Dr. King so eloquently articulated in his historic speech delivered in August of 1963 on the steps of Lincoln Memorial in Washington, DC.

Finally, it is an honor to serve in this capacity on the Virginia District.

Treasurer), and Charles Tillman (Black Ministries Coor.); William R. Dillon II, (Secretary pro tem); Ordained ministers--William R. Dillon II, Steven Guizar, Joyce Grambo, Samuel Montanez, and Stephen Willis; Lay members--Doug Fry, Mike Pittman, Tracy Spaur, Dianne Tolliver, and Sue Brown.

The District Advisory Board met six times during the church year to attend to the business of the district as set forth in the *Manual*, paragraphs 224-228.

Interim ministerial transfers have been processed accordingly and recorded in the Ministerial Credential Board report in accordance with the *Manual*, paragraphs 223, 228.9-228.10, 535-535.2.

We recommended to the Ministerial Credentials Board new or renewal district licenses for ministers serving as pastors: Edsel Conner, Floyd; Debbie Crofford, Eastern Shore; Cindy Estrada, Richmond El Remanente; Tabitha Jernigan, Victoria; Mario Mairena-Gonzalez, Tidewater Central Renacer Con Cristo; Benigno Martinez, Roanoke Amor Viviente; Rodney Mateer, Arlington First; Mike Morrison, Hampton Saunders Road; Martha Pulido, Woodstock Cristo Redentor; Jaqueline Sanchez-Gonzalez, Williamsburg Iglesia; Joe Wilson, Saltville.

The District Advisory Board approved the following:

- Churches that closed: Dumfries La Vid Verdadera, Roanoke Grandview Heights.
- Recommended the reinstatement and restoration to good standing of Nelson Villatoro and his credential returned (Manual, 540.10.1).
- New Churches that were organized this year: Lorton Santidad A Jehová, Salem Un Camino Mejor, Williamsburg Iglesia, Woodstock Cristo Redentor.
- Recommended Fredericksburg Salem Fields to the GMC for SF600.
- Property:
 - Authorized the sale of the Hampton church properties to the Hampton Puerta de Salvación church.
 - Authorized the Hampton Puerta de Salvación church to purchase the Hampton church properties.
- In light of the coronavirus pandemic a COVID Hope Fund was established to assist our churches and pastoral families in their time of need.
- Due to COVID-19, recommended the cancellation of the 2020 District Assembly to our presiding General Superintendent and that the work normally done by the District Assembly be conducted by the District Advisory Committee (District Advisory Board plus the chairpersons of the NMI, NYI, & SDMI) including the election of the delegates and alternates to the 2021 General Assembly.

- Due to COVID-19, requested all board and committee members whose terms were to expire this year to serve another year. All open terms will be filled at the 2021 District Assembly, providing that we are able to meet then.
- Due to COVID-19, cancelled all district in-person gatherings through July 2020, including all camps, retreats, committees, and board meetings.
- Approved the requests for CARES Act PPP Loans for churches, for the district and for the Virginia Nazarene Retreat Center. Loan request amounts reached nearly \$1.9 million.
- Approved the request for refinancing by the Richmond Hope Community Renewal
- Nazarene Safe: The DAB is reminding every church on the Virginia District to meet and comply with the standards set forth by Nazarene Safe. Nazarene Safe was developed to help churches create safe ministry environments, policies, and practices to prevent sexual misconduct and protect minors. We also ask that every church submit a copy of their local church's written and implemented sexual abuse/child protection policy to the DRC by July 30, 2020.

The Virginia District Advisory Board adopted the above actions and worked on many other items on behalf of the District Family. The District Advisory Board has faithfully served the Virginia District through prayer, counsel, and time. Thank you for your support and prayer as we continue to serve our great District.

2019-2020 Christian Action Committee Report

(This report is a repeat from last year)

- 1. We, the District Christian Action Committee, call the attention of the District Assembly to:
 - 1.1. The Greatest Commandment as proclaimed by Christ in Matthew 22:37-40: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it, 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."
 - 1.2. The Great Commission declared in Matthew 28:19-20: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."
 - 1.3. The Least of These as in Matthew 25:35-36 & 40. "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.""
 - 1.4. Isaiah 58:6 "Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke?"
 - 1.5. These are the marching orders we have been given. They are our motivation, mission, and call to Christian action. We urge our churches to join with the Spirit of Christ to advance the Kingdom of God in Virginia. To be the salt of the earth and light of the world, we do not fight with the same weapons as the darkness. Instead we arm ourselves as described in Ephesians 6:10-18.
- 2. We recommend that local churches use the following steps to carry out Christian actions in a way that fits our holy calling:
 - 2.1. That pastors, associates, evangelists, teachers, lay persons, parents and all church leaders encourage respect for the teachings of the Church of the Nazarene by regularly emphasizing to the local church the Covenant of Christian Character and the Covenant of Christian Conduct as stated in the Manual of the Church of the Nazarene, and derived from the Bible.
 - 2.2. That the local church board, under the direction of its pastor, appoints a local Christian Action Committee to keep the church informed of moral issues and to educate people with the Biblical holiness standard. Each Christian Action Committee will be given the responsibility of implementing a Christian action plan relevant to its community and the nation.
 - 2.3. Local Action Committees are encouraged to submit to the District Christian Action Committee a brief summary of their community involvement. That the local Christian Action Committees, under the direction of the church board, use the following as a minimum framework for the Christian action plans:

- 2.3.1. Support the sanctity of human life in all stages of life, as stated in Psalms 139:13-16 (NIV): "For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, your eyes saw my unformed body. All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." Confronting the tragedy of human trafficking is another piece in supporting the sanctity of human life.
- 2.3.2. Support the unity of the family and its formation in Christ-likeness, as stated in Ephesians 6:1-4 (NIV): "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' which is the first commandment with a promise that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." "Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."
- 2.3.3. Oppose all forms of domestic violence through education, counseling and Biblical preaching and teaching.
- 2.3.4. Provide families and individuals with suggestions for Christian activities that will promote strong moral character.
- 2.3.5. Encourage families to become involved, as much as possible, in activities of the church, community and school.
- 2.3.6. Urge parents to become actively involved in their children's education through school activities, communicating with teachers and local School Board members, voicing concern over such matters as bullying, alcohol use and drug abuse, sexual immorality, and acts of violence. We encourage praying for discernment about alternative forms of education such as Christian schools and home schooling.
- 2.3.7. Support marriages and the family by promoting marriage and family clinics, seminars, mentors, and providing Christian resources, such as Holiness Today and Focus on the Family. We encourage our churches to develop relationships with local Christian counselors.
- 2.3.8. That all pastors are familiar with the denominational position and Biblical standards on homosexuality and same sex marriage. A helpful resource from the Board of General Superintendents can be found at http://nazarene.org/files/docs/Perspectives Homosexuality.pdf.
- 2.3.9. Provide information and resources to address the following Christian conduct issues: gambling, premarital and extramarital sex, abortion, homosexuality, pornography, euthanasia, worldly entertainment, divorce, physical, emotional and sexual abuse, and substance abuse.
- 2.3.10. Increase awareness of and educate against substance abuse (such as: the use of alcohol and drug abuse, including the inappropriate use of prescription drugs), and to proactively engage in helpful ways to transform lives.
- 2.3.11. Lead our members, through example, in becoming actively involved in meeting human needs, such as poverty, alleviating suffering and welcoming the stranger.
- 2.3.12. Provide information and resources to address the following areas of growing concern: medical ethics, stewardship of creation, and the use of technology.
- 2.3.13. Model conflict resolution according to Scripture so that even in our conflict we Glorify God (Bring God into your situation); Get the Log Out (Own your part in the

conflict); Gently Restore (help others own their part of the conflict); Go and Be reconciled (Give forgiveness and Arrive at a Reasonable Solution) (for more information see Ken Sande, <u>Resolving Everyday Conflict</u> and www.peacemaker.net).

- 3. We, the District Christian Action Committee, urge each local Christian Action Committee and all Nazarenes to take the following practical steps to make an impact on their community and world:
 - 3.1. Research by reading books, magazines, and searching reputable sites on the internet to be knowledgeable about current moral issues. Use good judgment in evaluating resources through our Wesleyan-Holiness heritage.
 - 3.2. Register to vote and work to elect people who support holiness standards in government. Lovingly oppose any public office or official who undermines Judeo-Christian ethics by first praying for them, especially that the Spirit of Christ would work mightily in their hearts, writing letters, making phone calls, legally and ethically protesting, and expressing Christian views to others. Express thanks and support for those who stand up for holiness standards and Christian ethics.
 - 3.3. Minister to the needy of our community by feeding the hungry, taking care of widows and orphans, providing support to single parents, aiding the homeless in supporting themselves, etc., either through the local church or by partnering with other churches and community organizations.
 - 3.4. Choose only the most wholesome media and entertainment productions and use Christian websites on the Internet that provide source filtering of on-line content. May the advice of Susanna Wesley guide us: "Whatever weakens your reason, impairs the tenderness of your conscience, obscures your sense of God, takes off your relish for spiritual things, whatever increases the authority of the body over the mind, that thing is sin to you, however innocent it may seem in itself."
 - 3.5. Help the church board develop an evangelistic plan suited for the local community, which will help carry out the Great Commission.
 - 3.6. That every church board include this committee report as an agenda item at a fall board meeting this year, for prayer, conversation and action.
- 4. In conclusion, the District Christian Action Committee prays that the members of the Virginia District Church of the Nazarene would boldly proclaim with their lives what holiness and godliness look like. As stated in Hebrews 12:14 (NIV): "Make every effort to live in peace with all men and to be holy, without holiness no one will see the Lord." May the Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead truly make us people of the mission, who undeniably live in Godly love, so we may impact our communities for the Kingdom.

(This report is a repeat from last year)

The committee (Stephen Willis, Stephen Parker, Yeliz Mairena, Wynne Lankford, Marlon King, Joyce Grambo, Mary Jimenez, and Phil Fuller) reports the following:

Growing the church through evangelism & discipleship is reasonable and good

As a district of congregations committed to the mission of Christ to *"Make Christ-like disciples in the nations,"* we agree that it is perfectly reasonable and right to speak of expanding the kingdom through evangelism and discipleship. Growing the church is, *"Making room for and welcoming the non-believer into the family of God and shaping them to Christlikeness."* We believe this is primarily the work of God and that by his grace we are partners through our spirit-led efforts to see the church grow.

- When we are serious about seeing both the Great Commandment and the Great Commission fulfilled, there is no way to understand these great truths without them also including welcoming, even multiplying the number of new folks to the fellowship of believers.
- A church, to be healthy, must have both an inward and an outward focus. Health comes from equally emphasizing both discipleship and evangelistic.
- Jesus' first conversation with the disciples is about making them, "fishers of men" (evangelism) and his last conversation with them is the commandment to, "Go into all the world." (Evangelism) The essential outcome for a true disciple is to multiply through outreach.
- The Book of Acts records several instances where the church grows in number. Someone was not only counting but inviting others to celebrate the growth of the kingdom.
- Rather than make excuses about weak evangelism, limited discipleship or poor church growth, lets prayerfully support one another in this effort. We agree that being accountable for numbers for the sake of numbers is not helpful. Every pastor and church is significant.

5 Ways to **MINIMIZE** growth

- Do <u>not</u> expect guests.
- Do <u>not</u> preach evangelistically.
- Pray for God to move but do <u>not</u> plan as if He will.
- ✤ <u>Refuse</u> to change.
- <u>Always</u> say, "Yes!" to everything and become ineffective in <u>all</u> things.
- There are seasons of helpful pruning; however, pruning should eventually lead to growth.
 <u>Principles for the healthy growth of our churches:</u>
- Reinvention. Pastors, Church Boards and leaders must be willing to reinvent their ministry to ensure a healthy balance of outreach and discipleship.
- Intentionality. God's people must be intentional to connect with the unchurched and unbelievers.
- Mission mindset. Every believer is a missionary ... some even willingly.
- Expectations. Expect to have guests. Make a point to engage in a healthy conversation with your leaders about the "readiness" of your local church to receive guests. What barriers keep people from entering your gatherings.
- Yearly Training on Evangelism. Every local church should have a discipleship emphasis on how to share one's faith taught to your church at a minimum once a year.
- Monthly Focus on Evangelism. Healthy churches have a focus on evangelism at least monthly.
- Sacrifice. The growth of the church requires effort, cost, and a willingness to sacrifice.
- Prayer. Local leaders praying specifically for a revival of the mission and first love of the church.

Receive Insight from a Mentor.

- Passionate Evangelism Conversation in this assembly
- Consider being part of an Organic Outreach Cohort
- Leaders with evangelistic passion. Meet a couple of people whom God is using for evangelism.

Key learning principle/point:

I commit to a vibrant prayer ministry as a key to evangelistic growth, specifically asking God to help me and the church where I serve to develop an increasing evangelistic passion by:
2019-2020 Church Planting Initiative (DCPI)

This has been an excellent year for our Church Planting Initiative on the Virginia District. We were able to complete two of our three scheduled Dynamic Church Planting Training events this year. We have seen God move in powerful ways in the lives of pastors and laypeople alike, as they were inspired, informed, and engaged by the vision of planting new churches across Virginia.

Pastor Wayne Lynch first attended a DCPI training course about 5 years ago. Over those years that seed was watered until God grew it into a vision for a new Nazarene Church to be planted in Amelia County. Pastor Wayne attended another DCPI course this past year to finalize a plan in partnership with Southside Church to launch a new Campus Church.

As instructed through the DCPI experience, the Amelia team formed an advertising plan to help the community know about the launch, an outreach plan to engage new people, a discipleship plan to help their people grow, a funding plan to support the launch, and all the other parts necessary to give birth to a healthy new congregation.

In January, we saw the fruit of that labor as Southside Church – Amelia Campus was launched! In the first month, they saw salvations and rededications, many first time guests, growing small groups, and people who emphatically declared, "This is my church!"

It began with a vision from God. DCPI helped to partner that vision with a confident plan and ultimately the help that was needed to see it through. Just maybe, God has given you a vision. Join us at one of the upcoming DCPI training experience and see what God might do to bring that vision to life! 2020 Finance Committee Report

The Finance Committee makes the following recommendations:

Part I--Budget Considerations

- 1. That the formula for determining the total amount of the World Evangelism Fund, Pensions and Benefits Fund, Educational Budget, and District Unified Budget be as follows:
 - a. That church income (for budget purposes) be defined as any donation received by a church that qualifies as a charitable contribution. For more information on what qualifies as a charitable donation, go to www.fundingthemission.org.
 - b. That the church income given for World Evangelism Fund, 10% Mission Specials, and other mission offerings will be subtracted from the church income before the percentages that follow (listed in c.) are applied. For a list of the mission offerings that can be excluded, see the website www.fundingthemission.org.
 - c. That budgets be calculated on these percentages: World Evangelism, 5.5 percent; Pensions and Benefits, 2.25 percent; Educational, 2.25 percent; District Unified 5.0 percent. Each of these percentages is to be applied to church income less missions giving.
 - d. That any newly organized church will be allowed to pay their District Budget according to the following percentages: First year, 2 percent; second year, 3 percent; third year, 4 percent; fourth year, 5 percent. These percentages will be applied to church income less missions giving.
 - e. That New Start churches begin tithing (10%) of their income to the District Unified Budget, or World Evangelism Fund immediately (income exclusive of World Evangelism Fund and 10% mission specials).
 - f. That churches giving any money for individual New Starts receive 10% missions special credit by adding the amount to "point to point giving" on the local church giving report when using the online giving method. These new church plants must be approved annually by the District Advisory Board to qualify for the credit.
 - g. That sponsoring churches of a new church plant are eligible for a one-time (per new church plant) deduction of up to \$5,000 from their district budget if they contribute substantial financial support or members. (This deduction must be approved by the district advisory board and the district superintendent.)
 - h. That churches are encouraged, when appropriate, to make application through the DRC for Rare Circumstance Adjustments to denominational apportionments.
- 2. That the total estimated District Unified Budget be \$723,663 and that it be divided among the district interests as follows:

- 5. That the District SDMI Board, and NYI & NMI Councils each provide the Finance Committee a report of expenses and income for this year and a proposed budget for the next year by **April 20, 2021.**
- 6. That local church responsibilities be as follows:
 - a. That each local church, through its pastor and church board, prepare a total financial budget for the assembly year **2020-21** and mail a copy to the district office no later than **July 15, 2020.**
 - b. That all churches report their income at www.fundingthemission.org by the 10th of each month and that payments of all budgets be made at least monthly if not weekly, preferably using the online method available through <u>www.fundingthemission.org</u>.
 - c. That ALL APPORTIONMENTS (World Evangelism, Pensions and Benefits, Education, District) be given EQUAL consideration as a responsibility of the local church, and that recognition of faithful stewardship be based on the payment of all budgets in full. Pastors and leaders from churches that demonstrate support of the denomination through a predictable pattern of payment of apportionments will have the privilege of being considered for and elected or appointed to district leadership positions.
 - d. That no church take on an indebtedness that exceeds three times its annual income, averaged out over the previous 3 years, as recommended to us by the general church.
 - e. That no church will be granted permission to enter into a financially obligating program for building, hiring, or retaining staff, or any other purpose, that would prohibit keeping their funding the mission giving current.
 - f. That each church participates in the annual offerings for Nazarene Bible College and Nazarene Theological Seminary.
 - g. That each church review annually its property and liability insurance of all buildings and vehicles.
 - h. The District Unified Budget operates more than the district office and administrative responsibilities of the district, but it also supports all aspects of the work of the district, including, New Church Development, The Virginia Nazarene Retreat Center and its ministry, and support for our auxiliary departments of the District: SDMI, NYI and NMI. All Churches are encouraged to fully support the district apportionment so that all aspects of district ministries are fully funded.
 - i. In harmony with the Manual, par. 33, only those members of local congregations who practice consistent storehouse tithing be nominated for elective offices in the local church.
- 7. The Advisory Board will appoint a finance team available to local churches on request to give

instructional assistance in their financial management.

- 8. That the travel allowance for official board meetings, councils, or committees be at 45 cents per mile except for district employees/staff which will be at the IRS business mileage standard.
- 9. That the district superintendent be granted one month's vacation with pay.

Part 2--Pastors' and Associate Pastors' Compensation

Action Plan

- 1. Compensation for ministers by the church includes the following as a minimum:
 - a. Salary.
 - b. Reasonable housing expenses.
 - c. Self-employment tax.
 - d. Family health insurance coverage.
 - e. Paid vacation (see item 4 below).
- 2. Suggested additional benefits:
 - a. Contribution to the Nazarene 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan.
 - b. Accountable medical reimbursement plan.
 - c. Dental insurance.
 - d. Life insurance.
 - e. Accidental death/long term disability insurance coupled with a salary continuation plan.
 - f. Annual physical examination (at church expense).
 - g. A Sabbatical plan (see item 5 below).
 - h. The church board shall review not less frequently than annually, the compensation package of each pastor employed. A report shall be sent to the District Superintendent of the results of each review.
- 3. Professional Expenses. Churches should include in their annual budgets line items of sufficient amount to reimburse professional and business expenses for ministry through accountable reimbursement plans. These will include but are not limited to:
 - a. Mileage reimbursement rate: current IRS mileage rate.
 - b. Meal and entertainment reimbursements.
 - c. Books, online resources, subscriptions.
 - d. Continuing education expenses (completion of two continuing education units is required of Nazarene ministers annually).
 - e. Office supplies.
 - f. Gifts the pastors give to members on occasions of weddings, graduations and showers.
 - g. Costs for attending and participating at the General Assembly in 2021.
 - h. That churches cover costs for district retreats for the Pastor and Spouse, DIG Campmeeting,
 District and General Assembly. That strong consideration be given to covering the expenses of
 qualifying pastors or pastor's spouses to the Annual District Ladies Ministry Retreat.
- 4. Vacation Guidelines:
 - a. Churches are encouraged to establish a vacation guideline with the following minimums. Years of service indicates total number of years in ministry.

- From 0 up to 5 years of service--2 weeks including 3 Sundays
- From 5 up to 14 years of service--3 weeks including 4 Sundays
- More than 14 years of service--4 weeks including 5 Sundays
- b. That churches not consider the following as vacation: Ministry Team Retreat, District Assembly, General Assembly, DIG Campmeeting, Camp Work Days, district events sponsored by SDMI, NYI, or NMI, denominational events sponsored by the general church, and district committee meetings.
- c. Because rest and renewal are important even vital components of effective ministry, pastors are encouraged to use the entire period of their allotted vacation days every year. To strengthen this ideal, no more than one week of accumulated vacation can be carried over to the next fiscal year. Additionally, at the beginning and the end of a pastor's service, vacation is provided on a yearly prorated basis (i.e., one month of service of one year provides 1/12th of the annual vacation allotment).
- 5. Sabbatical Plan:

Upon completion of every five to seven years of service at the same church, we recommend that each minister, with the approval of the church board, and subject to the approval of the District Superintendent (for the lead pastor), plan a sabbatical of no less than 30 days. A sabbatical taken by any minister during the District Assembly must be approved by the District Superintendent. The sabbatical period is not to be counted against the minister's annual vacation time. A sabbatical is a necessary time for planned spiritual, physical, and emotional rest and works to alleviate burnout and its symptoms. Planned sabbaticals renew both ministers and congregations, and increase the length of tenures in ministry. Longer tenures, in turn, positively affect congregational health. Salary and benefits should continue during the sabbatical period. Churches should also cover reasonable expenses incurred in planning and taking the sabbatical. For more information visit the district website: www.vanaz.org.

- 6. Maintaining Balance and Well-Being in Ministry. Pastors and staff are to be encouraged by their church boards to commit to God's plan for rest and renewal, which includes but is not limited to:
 - a. Protect private time with the Lord each day.
 - b. Rest one full day each week completely avoiding ministry responsibilities (phone, email, visits, administration, etc.).
 - c. Plan and take vacations that are a complete break from ministry responsibilities.
 - d. Plan periodic times of spiritual renewal.
 - e. Carefully discern God's will and confer with family prior to accepting additional ministry responsibilities.
- 7. Pastoral Appreciation:
 - a. Appreciation Month: We recommend that the church plan and carry out special appreciation activities for pastors and their families in October or other suitable month each year.
 - b. Christmas Bonus: We recommend that the church plan for and present an additional week's pay (at minimum) as a Christmas bonus to ministers.
- 8. Evangelists. The General Superintendents have suggested the following guidelines:
 - a. Cover the evangelist's travel expenses both to and from the local church.

- b. Provide housing, meals, and study resources while the evangelist is serving the local congregation.
- c. In consultation with the evangelist, contribute to the evangelist's retirement.
- d. Where appropriate, designate a portion of the compensation as housing allowance.
- e. Pay a stipend equal to twice that of the pastor's compensation, including housing, plus benefits.
- f. Remember the evangelist at Christmas with a generous love offering.

Part 3 -- Financial Safeguards for Pastors and Local Churches

- 1. The Church of the Nazarene operates on a principle that the Pastor of a local church be strictly limited from access to the funds of the local church and that ultimate accountability for the finances of the Church remain in the hands of the duly elected Church Board (or its appointed Finance Committee) on behalf of the local congregation.
- 2. By limiting the access to finances by the Pastor, the Church helps to strengthen the pastor's reputation and the liberty of his or her ministry. To strengthen this safeguard principle a number of important systems are in place:
- 3. The Church Board, acting on behalf of the Church Membership, shall...
 - a. elect a treasurer to provide accounting of all funds (see 129.20).
 - b. cause careful accounting to be kept of all money received and disbursed by the church, including any childcare/schools (birth through secondary) and Nazarene Missions International (NMI), Nazarene Youth International (NYI), Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI), and make report of the same at its regular monthly meetings and to the annual meeting of the church. (129.21)
 - c. provide a committee, no fewer than two members of which shall count and account for all money received by the church. (129.22)
 - d. establish an annual budget of income and expenditures for every department of the Church. This action is a primary duty of the Board. (See manual 129.6).
 - e. assign to a committee of the Board the responsibilities of monitoring the Church Budget and reporting to the Board the financial conditions and concerns of the Church. (129.7)
 - f. send of copy of the annual budget to the District Resource Center by **July 15** each year. This requirement is by action of the District Assembly upon the recommendation of the District Finance Committee.
 - g. review financial reports monthly which have been prepared for this purpose by the Church Treasurer (136.4)
- 4. Specifically, regarding the Pastor:
 - a. No pastor or any member of his or her immediate family, shall be authorized to have direct access to church funds and or serve as Church Treasurer (including handling cash, and/or signing checks, use of ATM cards, Debit Cards or other electronic transaction methods that are directly linked to the Church operating accounts or savings accounts, however they be named).
 - b. The pastor may be listed as an officer of the Church with the bank so long as this administrative function does not grant direct access to Church funds.
 - c. The pastor and/or immediate family members shall not participate in the counting of moneys for any church related funds. Immediate family includes spouse, children, siblings, or parents.

- d. The pastor shall not contract bills, create financial obligations, or disburse funds for the local church unless authorized and directed by majority vote of the church board of an organized church or by majority vote of a church meeting of an organized church. One method by which a church board or church meeting can authorize such expenses is the use of an approved expense budget, which includes regular (monthly) review by the Church Board. Such budget and monthly review shall be duly recorded in the minutes of the church board or of the minutes of the church meeting.
- e. The pastor shall have access to all records of the local church. (129.23)
- 5. Annually, the Church Board will ensure that all the financial records of the Church, including all auxiliaries, are audited or examined. The Church Board has a duty to appoint an auditing committee or a committee of independent examiners, or such other qualified persons, that shall audit or examine, to at least the minimum standard required by national or state law if applicable, or other recognized professional standards, at least annually, the financial records of the treasurer of the church, the Nazarene Youth International (NYI), the Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries International (SDMI) Board, Nazarene childcare/schools (birth through secondary), and any other financial records of the church. (129.23)
- 6. Any exceptions to the above (which are extremely rare) must be approved in writing by the District Advisory Board and the District Superintendent. (517)
- 7. Proactive Steps for Expenditure Reimbursement:
 - a. Because an expenditure of funds is necessary for the operation of the local church, and because Pastors are often responsible for seeing that certain expenditures are made the following are recommended methods for accountability and flexibility for such expenditures:
 - i. Use of a small petty cash with regular accountability to the Church Board.
 - ii. Use of prepaid debit cards which do not have direct access to Church bank accounts.
 - iii. Use of credit cards with accountability for expenditures to Church Board.
 - iv. Use of personal funds followed by appropriate reimbursement.
 - b. All methods of reimbursement shall follow guidelines for an Accountable Reimbursement Plan whereby, once the expense is incurred, the request for reimbursement reports the time, date, location, amount and purpose of the expenditure prior to reimbursement, and that these reimbursements are reviewed by the Church Board through an appropriate method.

A report of this action is due to the District Superintendent by **October 15, 2020.**
- 4. <u>For all items identified in the Finance Committee Report the district policy is to be applied in churches which have not established local policies.</u>

Partial Report No. 2

The Nominations Committee met on Thursday, April 14, 2020 at 6:45 p.m. by Zoom.

Members Present: J. Phillip Fuller, chairman; Bill Dillon, secretary; Jacquie Gomez, Exec. Administrative Assistant; Rigoberto Acosta, Hispanic Coach; Bucky Wince, Robin Hatcher, David Taylor, Becky Dunman, Jill Whitt, Joann Stocks, James Heyward, Athan Burch, David Alberto Perez, Carolyn Godbey, Vicki Bohall, Julie Jackson, Camelot Shuff, Jullie Kelley, Joe Wilson, Nathan Rice, Marlon King, Pam Edelman, Virginia Pruitt and Sharon Harrison

The following motions concerning our elections were passed

- that "in accordance with the provisions of the Board of General Superintendents, and due to the pandemic emergency circumstances, all currently elected leaders are asked to continue serving for an additional period of one year until District Assembly 2021"
- that "terms of service for elected district leaders set to expire in 2020 will now expire in 2021, while terms of service that were set to expire in 2021 and beyond remain the same."

- That "a person may not serve as a delegate in more than one of these: Global NYI, NMI, or SDMI Convention AND a person may not be a member of a Global Convention and also be a delegate to the General Assembly except for ex-officio members (NMI President, SDMI Chair, or NYI President)."
- For General Assembly Ministerial Delegates--that one ballot be taken from all eligible clergy to select the top 48 (including ties, with a limit of no more than 50 names on the DAC Ballot) that become the nominees to the DAC.
- For General Assembly Laity Delegates--that a nominating ballot be presented to the District Advisory Committee acting as the District Assembly containing at least 24 laity members to be elected by the Assembly.
- A second ballot for each category, consisting of all those not elected as delegates, will be prepared and one further (third) vote taken to select alternates in the order of the votes received on said ballot and that the district elect the maximum possible number of alternates
- Specifically in the election of delegates to the General Assembly, the Nominating Committee recommends the following procedures:
 - Ministerial Delegates
 - That the allowable number of ministerial delegates shall be determined by Manual stipulation (Manual paragraph 301.1), which is four (4), less one (1), inasmuch as the district superintendent is a delegate by virtue of the office (Manual 205.23). The Virginia District will send four ministerial delegates, one of which is the district Superintendent, necessitating the election of three (3) people.
 - That a qualifying ballot be presented to the Nominating Committee containing the names of all assigned, full-time ordained ministers that have not reached retirement status, and that the results of that ballot be presented to the District Advisory Committee acting on behalf of the district assembly containing the names of forty-eight (48) assigned, full-time ordained ministers that have not reached retirement status as a nominating ballot, and that after the nominating ballot, the number of nominees be reduced for the elective ballot to no more than eleven (11) names to be elected, in order of votes received (Manual paragraph 205.23).
 - That from the above electing ballot, the allowable number of ministerial delegates shall be elected by plurality vote.

• Ministerial Alternate Delegates

- That the district assembly may elect eight (8) alternates which is equal to twice the total number of ministerial delegates allowed, including the district superintendent (Manual paragraph 205.23).
- That one ballot be taken on the remaining eight (8) nominees (see section "b" above), and they shall be declared ministerial alternate delegates, in order of votes received.
- Lay Delegates
 - That a nominating ballot be presented to the District Advisory Committee acting as the district assembly containing at least twenty-four lay members to be elected by the assembly (Manual paragraph 301.1); and that they recommend to the DAC that

after the nominating ballot, the number of nominees be reduced for the elective ballot to no more than twelve (12) nominees (Manual paragraphs 205.23, 301.1).

- That from the above electing ballot, the number of four (4) lay delegates shall be elected by plurality vote.
- Lay Alternate Delegates
 - That the district assembly may elect eight (8) alternates which is equal to twice the total number of lay delegates allowed.
 - That one ballot be taken on the remaining eight (8) nominees (above), and the authorized number shall be declared lay alternate delegates, in order of votes received.

General Assembly Delegates and Alternates ballots were taken and the committee is presenting these ballots for voting by the District Advisory Committee.

GENERAL ASSEMBLY DELEGATE - CLERGY
